Did you Know?

Our uniform policy has a few minor changes:

Mass uniform for girls-

Girls grades K-5 are encouraged to wear the SHCS plaid jumper or skort with short or long sleeve SHCS logo shirt, however, the jumper/skort is NOT mandatory.

2. Non-uniform Attire

Students may occasionally be allowed the privilege of a non-uniform day. These instances may be for special occasions or earned through classroom award. Student cooperation is the key to the implementation and success of a non-uniform dress code. Non uniform clothing should reflect Christian values with respect to graphics, lettering and physical fit

Shirts: Midriffs, cleavage and under garments must be covered. No revealing or sheer shirts will be allowed. No spaghetti strap shirts.

Skirts/Dresses/Shorts: Skirts, dresses and shorts must be no more than 2 inches above the knee. If shorter dresses are worn, then opaque tights or leggings must be worn. No biker shorts or cut offs allowed.

Pants: Pants may not be worn below the hip.

Leggings, yoga pants, and other skin-tight pants, including skinny jeans: Because of the revealing nature of these clothing items, students who wear

them must wear a shirt or top that extends to the knee.

Undergarments: Undergarments may not be showing at any time.

School Advisory Meetings

The School Advisory Committee (SAC) is opening meetings in 2015-16 to the School and Parish. You are welcome to attend and hear what we are working on this year!

What role does SAC play in the school?

SAC is advisory in nature and consultative to the Principal and Pastor. The SAC cannot act apart from the Principal or Pastor and cannot make decisions binding for the Parish School without the approval of the Pastor and the Principal. Consultation also means that decisions by the Pastor or the Principal will not be made in major matters affecting the parish school until and unless the SAC has been consulted.

The areas in which the council has responsibility includes:

- A. Advancement/Public Relations/Marketing
- B. Education Programs Support
- C. Finance/Budget Development/Tuition

Recommendation/Fundraising Efforts D. Policy Development

- E. Provide representation for selection of the Principal
- F. Strategic Planning

How can I attend a meeting?

SAC meetings are held the third Wednesday of the month in the Marion rooms from Aug-May. Meeting agendas and minutes are found on the school website under the Community Tab – School Advisory.

Can I speak at a SAC meeting?

Visitors can make presentations and speak to SAC, no longer than 10 minutes in length, by contacting the Principal or Chair and asking to be placed on the Agenda. The request can be verbal or in writing and must be at least 48 hours before the meeting. The only time for visitors to speak will be at the beginning of the meeting. After this time, visitors may be physically present although they cannot directly (verbally) address SAC.

Will the entire SAC meeting be open?

When confidential/sensitive topics are being discussed, the SAC may go into closed session and the meeting will be closed. This will normally happen toward the end of the meeting and will be clearly marked on the agenda.

Are children welcome at SAC meetings?

SAC meeting are business in nature and as a result we ask that only Parents/Guardians/Parishioner's attend. Child care is not provided.
