Security—

Recently in the news, there have been some incidents related to school security. Keeping our students safe while at school is our top priority. Listed below are several safety measure currently in place designed to safeguard students and to affect positive student learning in the classroom. As always, I welcome your comments and would be delighted to discuss any ideas or concerns you may have regarding the matter of school safety or emergency preparedness.

- Security Doors—All doors remained locked during the day. Visitors must enter the school by door 8. If the school office recognizes you, they will buzz you in the door. If not, they will ask visitors to identify themselves. All visitors are asked to stop by the school office to sign in and a volunteer badge is given.
- If students leave during the school day, parents must come in the building to sign the student out.
- Please help us monitor the door. If you do not know the person walking in with you, either wait to be buzzed in for the person to identify themself with office staff or you may follow them to make sure they stop by the school office to sign in.
- The office staff monitor the four security cameras that are strategically placed inside the building.
- All classrooms have a red emergency folder for the classroom teacher with protocols for all types of emergency information.
- We practice 5 fire drills, 5 lock downs, and 1 tornado drill each year, as required.
- The office staff have a Crisis Communication Plan with information to maintain safety throughout a crisis.

The principal communicates with the Robbinsdale Police Dept. for updated protocols for emergency situations.



Students at Sacred Heart wrap up another successful annual Catholic Schools Raffle, raising \$9,080

Robbinsdale, MN -- It's the combined effort of students, families, staff and the community surrounding Sacred Heart Catholic School that helped raise an amazing total of \$9,080 for the school through the 2017 Catholic Schools Raffle.

While the annual fundraiser involves more than 80 schools in three states and raised over \$1,066,450 in 2017, every dollar raised by Sacred Heart stays right here in Robbinsdale.

"Again this year, our Catholic Schools Raffle is proving to be one of the largest fundraisers for parochial education in the Upper Midwest. To date, over \$6 million has been raised, and we are incredibly proud that 100 percent of that total has gone directly to schools like Sacred Heart to use in supporting their educational mission," Catholic United President Harald Borrmann said. "Congratulations to all the students, parents, faculty, administrators and neighbors who have helped make this program such an unqualified success. When so many good folks get together for a worthy cause, great things happen. Our sincerest thanks to all involved."

Before the Raffle began on Jan. 13, the staff at Sacred Heart Catholic School set a fundraising goal. Sponsor Catholic United Financial provided all promotional materials, raffle tickets and prizes for the program to the school at no cost. Sacred Heart provided the volunteers, energy and creativity to make the most of the six-week program.

Ticket sales and donations were collected by students and volunteers through Feb. 26, totaling \$9,080. The Raffle wrapped up on March 9 with a prize drawing ceremony broadcast live on the Catholic United Financial website. The prizes, valued at more than \$40,000 total, included a brand-new 2017 Jeep, vacation and travel packages, iPads, Amazon Fire TVs, and more.

Catholic United also rewarded the hard work of student ticket sellers. The top-selling student at Sacred Heart won a new Kindle Fire tablet, and the top selling class won a pizza party. With this successful fundraiser now finished for the year, every student at the school will benefit.
