From the Principal

The 2016-2017 school year has been a successful year at Sacred Heart Catholic School. I wanted to take the time to share with you where we have been, what we have learned and where we are going. Sacred Heart Catholic School is accredited by MNSAA (Minnesota Nonpublic School Accreditation Association). Our current strategic plan will expire in 2017, so now we begin the process of completing a Self Study report and new strategic plan for the years 2018-2024. I hope this Annual Report will give you a snapshot of our past year and a glimpse of what is to come.

We are proud of our teachers for completing their STEM certificate through St. Catherine's University. We thank the teachers for the extra time they put in above and beyond their normal teaching duties. Over the last two years, our teachers studied and learned together to further their knowledge of best practices in teaching and learning. What a gift we have been given. Here is a short list of learning experiences from this year:

- > STARBASE (gr. 4/5) -This 5 day camp puts STEM in students' hands by providing engaging activities rooted in science, technology, math and engineering.
- > STEMLink (gr. 5/6) Students participated in three interactive sessions with professionals from the fields of biology, physics, math, cybersecurity, and computer science.
- > Creativity Festival (gr. 3/4) Students explored different ways to learn first-hand the importance of flexible thinking, risk-taking, communication and self-expression.
- > Partnered with Totino-Grace High School –Students in grade 6-7 learned how to use a coding program called Arduino.
- ➤ H2O for Life (School-wide project)—Lessons, service-learning, and an assembly that helped raise awareness about the global water crisis.
- Pond Study (gr. 6-8) Partnered with two other Catholic STEM schools to implement a pond study that was Integrated across all subject areas.
- Pumpkin Drop (gr. K-8) Students used the engineering design process to create a cradle for their pumpkin to survive the drop from the school roof.
- Summer STEM classes-Students, ages 4-8, participated in free STEM classes this summer.

Together, we served others through experiences with service projects such as H2O for Life, Feed My Starving Children, NEAR food drives, visiting seniors at Copperfield, grandfriends, making valentines for parishioners, and Pre K visiting Good Samaritan Home each month.

Sacred Heart Catholic School is blessed with amazing support from school families, parishioners, former students, parish leadership, staff and the greater community. I am proud to share the accomplishments of the 2016-2017 school year and the excitement of starting a new school year.

Sacred Heart Catholic School 2017 NWEA Standardized Testing Results

Every fall and spring our students in grades 1-8 take the NWEA Measures of Achievement (MAP) test to help teachers understand where each student stands and where extra learning is needed. The spring testing results are in and our students rank in the top 15% of students in the country who took the test! Our goal is to be in the 85^{th} percentile at each grade level.

Overall Proficiency School Data

As a school, our students have performed very well due to our high academic standards and curriculum. The following scores represent grades 2-8.

Reading 73% (Grades 3-8) Math 80% (Grades 3-8) Language 73% (Grades 3-8) Science 77% (Grades 5-8)

School Goals for 2017-2018

- Complete and update curriculum maps for all grades/subjects to align curriculum with state standards.
- Implement new math curriculum for grades K-8 by providing professional development, grade level meetings, and creating a protocol of math guidelines for all grades.
- Implement "Defined Stem" integrated lessons across all grade levels.
- Provide further professional development for teachers on how to use NWEA reports to guide group and individualized instruction in the classroom.
- Revise our current marketing plan for Pre-K and K-8 program to retain, recruit and increase community awareness.
- Plan and implement a new fundraising revenue stream to supplement the school budget in the amount of \$10.000.
- Create a 3 year plan for our C-STEM program to ensure success of our new initiative.
- Increase Pre-K awareness of new branding "Faithful Beginnings" and increate Pre-K to kinder retention.
- Complete MNSAA Self-Study along with a new strategic plan for 2018-2024.
- Finalize new school mission statement and philosophy.
- Create a 3 year plan for our Outdoor Learning space on school grounds. Complete year 1 during the 2017-2018 school year.
- Install new carpet in grades 1-4.
- Purchase new student desks/chairs for grades 1-5 along with flexible seating options for all grades.
- Implement a new classroom management plan using EnVoy for grades K-4.
- Provide staff training focusing on "Creating a Positive School Culture" using Top20Training.
- Purchase and implement the "Great Escape Classroom Workshop" to promote problem solving skills for STEM.

2015-2016 School Budget Actual Results

The Sacred Heart Catholic School budget is developed by the Principal and Parish Business Administrator in collaboration with the Finance Council with input provided by the School Advisory Committee. Upon the recommendation of the Finance Council, the Trustees and Pastor approve the final budget.
