Fun Facts about the 2018-2019 school year

- Sacred Heart Catholic School received the following Readers' Choice Awards: Best Childcare in Robbinsdale, Best Preschool in Robbinsdale, Best Principal in Robbinsdale, New Hope and Golden Valley.
- We had 157 students in K-8th grade and 31 three and four year olds in our Pre-K Program.
- We gradutated 16 8th graders. They will be attending DeLaSalle High School, Totino-Grace, Armstrong, Cooper, and St. Francis High School.
- We implemented new curriculum this year for our K-8 science program, called STEMscopes and a new reading program, Journeys, for grades 3-5.
- A reading specialist was added to our teaching staff to support the needs of all our students.
- Our middle school students took part in a 2-day engineering lab at the MN
 Zoo researching animal habitats and then designing their own habitat.
- We have a new outdoor garden space along Hubbard Ave. This space will be used for outdoor learning to support our C-STEM program.
- We implemented MakerSpaces in our school library and our STEM room.
- Each student painted a Kindness Rock for our outdoor garden. On Earth Day, we gathered for a prayer service and placed our rocks in the garden.
- Six students participated in the Archdiocesan Big Bang STEM science fair.
- All middle school students participated on our Leadership Team this year to help plan service projects and events for grade 6-8.
- Fr. Pedersen created the Keep it or Cut it Challenge to help raise funds for our our 5th annual Gala.
- We celebrated the 100th Anniversary of Armistice Day in November to honor those that have served or are serving in the military.

Teacher Appreciation: Acknowledged teachers during teacher appreciation week.


End of School Luncheon: Planned and purchased lunch for teachers and support staff.


Concerts: Provided hospitality at our winter and spring concerts.


Students: Paid for bussing for our Catholic Schools Week field trip to Roller Gardens.


2019 NWEA Standardized Testing Results

Every fall and spring our students in grades K-8 take the NWEA Measures of Achievement (MAP) test to help teachers understand where each student stands and where extra learning is needed. The spring testing results are in and our students scored above the national norm.








2017-2018 School Financial Results
