Tuition Assistance

- Approximately 49% of the student body, K-8, received tuition assistance.
- > The calculated need for those applying for tuition was over \$200,000.
- Tuition assistance is offered to all qualifying families with students in Kindergarten- 8th grade.
- Assistance is generated through Lend a Hand, Sacred Heart Parish General Operating Fund, Aim Higher Foundation, Catholic Community Foundation, Catholic Service Appeal Foundation

Fun Facts about the 2019-2020 school year

- Sacred Heart Catholic School received the following Readers' Choice Awards: Best Private School, Best Childcare, Best Preschool, , Best Principal, Best Teacher-Molly Monson, in Robbinsdale and Crystal.
- The first time in over 5 years, we had an increase in enrollment.
- We had 161 students in K-8th grade and 35 three and four year olds in our Pre-K Program.
- We gradutated 14 8th graders. They will be attending DeLaSalle High School, Benilde-St. Margaret, Totino-Grace, Armstrong, Brooklyn Center, and Andover High School.
- Sacred Heart Parish and School participated in a cohort to enhance our Development efforts focusing on our operational vitality. We surveyed our parents, teachers, parishioners to determine our top 10 challenges to create a strategic plan.
- We implemented new curriculum this year for our K-5 religion program called "Spirit of Truth".
- A new online admissions and enrollment program called TADS was selected and implemented for the 2020-2021 school year.
- A new reading program was implemented called "Believe and Read" supported by CSCOE and Groves Academy for PreK-3rd grade.
- We implemented Engineering Week for K-8th grade. We took a week off in February to work on a a project that focused on the Engineering Proces.
- Six students were selected to participate in the virtual Archdiocesan Big Bang STEM science fair and seven students were selected to participate in regional History Day.
- We added a new computer program for our math students, called IXL, which will help differentiate skills for our students.
- All middle school students participated team buliding activities this year during advisory time.
- Our students collected funds through service projects to raise funds for Harvest Pack. K-8 students were scheduled to pack food in spring, but it was postponed due to distance learning. It has been rescheduled for Fall.
- Our middle school students participated in an all-day retreat with the NET Ministries Team.
- Our youth group created a new middle school "girls club" that met on a weekly basis with our faith formation associate.
- We participated in Screenagers Week this fall. Lessons were taught to our students on internet safety and we had a parent night that included Judy Stoffel, author of "A Parents Guide to Screen Use", and a Robbinsdale Police officer.
- A new extra-curricular activity was added for after school---Karate!
- Our students and teachers started distance learning for the 3rd trimester of school.

The Sacred Heart Catholic School budget is developed by the Parish Business Administrator and Principal in collaboration with the Finance Council with input provided by the School Advisory Council. Upon the recommendation of the Finance Council, the Trustees and Pastor approve the final budget.



Parish Subsidy represents 23.7% of Total Parish Offertory.
