
Tuition Assistance


- Approximately 48% of the student body, K-8, received tuition assistance.
- > The calculated need for those applying for tuition was over \$300,000.
- Tuition assistance is offered to all qualifying families with students in Kindergarten- 8th grade.

- Preschool tuition assistance is provided through Think Small Scholarships and the Schulze Family Foundation.




2021 NWEA Standardized Testing Results






2020-2021 School Financial Results
